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A MESSAGE FROM OUR SUPERINTENDENT



Dear LCMR Community Member:

The Lower Cape May Regional School District will be asking its district residents to participate in a \$13,900,000 bond referendum vote on Tuesday, January 25, 2022, to fully air condition all of its school buildings, upgrade existing HVAC systems, and to replace the roof at the middle school. One of the lessons learned during the current health crisis was the importance of a modern, well equipped HVAC system in our schools to support healthy air

quality and climate control features which will provide an environment conducive to learning for our students.

As district voters consider this referendum there are several key points I would encourage you to keep in mind:

- 1. The school district will use this bond referendum to replace existing debt service which is set to expire this year. As such, by simply replacing existing debt service, there will be <u>NO INCREASE IN TAXES TO OUR RESIDENTS AS A RESULT OF THIS PROJECT.</u>
- 2. The purpose of this project is to improve our facilities to support healthy air quality and climate control in our buildings for all of our students and staff who learn and work in our facilities each day.
- 3. The district recently received an influx of Federal ESSER Funds designed to aid school districts in their efforts to provide a healthy environment to combat the circumstances brought about by the pandemic. Our district will apply over \$1.7 million dollars of ESSER funds to offset the cost of this project.
- 4. The LCMR school district qualifies for the New Jersey State Debt Service Aid program which will provide 40% of the cost of this project further reducing the financial burden to the district.

This entire edition of our district newsletter is devoted to providing you detailed information about the bond referendum and the project it will finance. My intention is to provide all district residents with the facts of this initiative to assist in your consideration of support for this referendum. 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What

A special Referendum Question to authorize the District to raise funds through the sale of bonds to finance the 'Building Excellence" facilities reinvestment initiative is planned for Tuesday, January 25, 2022.

The scope of the \$13.9 million referendum includes necessary improvements to the Middle School and the High School.

These projects include replacement of the Middle School roof, and HVAC upgrades and improvements. The District will also apply ESSER and Federal ARP funds for the HVAC upgrades and improvements thus reducing the cost to the taxpayer.

State Aid Now Available

Because of the planning by the Board of Education and its professional advisors, the District is in a position to take advantage of the state's **Debt Service Aid** program.

The State of New Jersey will pay approximately 40% of the cost of all of these projects as part of the aid program. Under the Debt Service Aid program, the District initially funds the entire cost of the projects and the state reimburses the District on an annual basis for the approved projects.

How Much

The all-inclusive cost estimates for the Referendum are:

| Middle School | \$7,792,616 |

The Referendum amount on which we will vote, is the Total Cost of \$13,900,000. The **\$5,560,000** will come back to the District as reimbursement on an annual basis.

Impact on Your Taxes

The District's Financial Advisors have made a preliminary analysis of the costs of the \$13.9 M bonds, minus the Debt Service Aid, over 20 years.

The current estimate for the average annual local tax to actually decrease over the 20 year loan based on average assessed values in our communities is as follows:
