Lower Cape May Regional High School is a four year comprehensive public High School that serves students from Cape May, West Cape May, Lower Township, Cape May Point and now Choice School students. Approximately one thousand high school students follow a modified block schedule that allows them to earn up to 160 credits toward a New Jersey High School Diploma. Many of these students also graduate with College Credit from their High School coursework. Still more students take advantage of a wide variety of Advanced Placement, and Career and Technical education programs. Students also have the opportunity to earn industry credentials such as Microsoft Office Certification. Students can participate in off campus credit bearing Senior Experience work preparation programs and participate in a tremendous variety of interscholastic athletics, leadership organizations, Honor Societies and clubs.

Ninth grade teams ensure small class sizes and individualized attention. A comprehensive guidance and advisement program allows students to explore their areas of interest and follow an individual learning plan designed to make the most of the High School experience. As students progress, many become part of one of five academies for Engineering, Culinary Arts, Visual and Performing Arts, Business, and Human and Public Service. These academies contain unique courses such as Tomorrow’s Teachers, Principles of Engineering, Law Enforcement, The 21st Century Office, Modern Music Production, Graphic Design, TV Media Production, Dance, Guitar, Piano, Band, Choir and Orchestra. Lower Cape May Regional High School has a full program in Industrial Arts for Woodworking, coursework in Sewing and Fashion Design, Drawing, and Painting.
