- 1794 **Jay's Treaty** Controversial Treaty with Britain

1800 -1899 - Settling Boundaries and Expansion

- 1814 Treaty of Ghent End of War of 1812
- 1817 Rush/Bagot Treaty demilitarized Great Lakes
- 1818 **Treaty of 1818** joint occupation of Oregon
- 1819 Adams/Onis Treaty Western border & Florida
- 1842 **Webster/Ashburton Treaty** Maine border (Aroostook War)
- 1846 **Oregon Treaty** settled U.S./Canada border at 49th parallel
- 1848 Treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo End of Mexican War
- 1850 Clayton/Bulwer Treaty step toward building canal in Central America
- 1867 **Alaska Purchase** "Seward's Folly"

<u>1901-1941</u> – Imperialism/Retreat to Isolationism

- 1901 **Hay/Pauncefote Treaty** next step in canal (with Britain)
- 1903 Hay/Bunau-Varrilla Treaty Panama Canal
- 1905 Treaty of Portsmouth End of Russo-Japan War
- 1908 Gentleman's Agreement Japanese immigration
- 1917 Lansing Ishii Agreement Japan/Open Door Policy
- 1919 Treaty of Versailles end of WW1 (not ratified)
- 1922 Washington Naval Treaty limits on battleships
- 1928 Kellogg-Briand Pact "outlaws" war

<u>1941-1998</u> – Cold War/Superpower

- 1941 Atlantic Charter U.S. & Britain WW2
- 1944 **Bretton Woods Agreement** established IMF & World Bank
- 1945 **UN Charter** creation of the United Nations
- 1949 North Atlantic Treaty Organization Alliance with W. Europe
- 1954 Southeast Asia Collective Defense Treaty Alliance in SE Asia
- 1963 Partial Test Ban Treaty Bans tests of nuclear weapons
- 1972 Strategic Arms Limitation Treaty
- 1979 Strategic Arms Limitation Treaty II
- 1988 Intermediate/Range Nuclear Forces Treaty (INF)
- 1991 Strategic Arms Reduction Treaty
- 1993 Strategic Arms Reduction Treaty II
- 1994 North American Free Trade Agreement No tariffs with Canada & Mexico
