ALOUETTE (*The Lark*) is a popular folk song of French-Canadian origin. As the song leader names the various parts of the bird's anatomy, he points to his own body. The chorus repeats the refrain with enthusiasm.

Et la tête, et la tête, a - lou - ett', a - lou - ett', oh!


